About the Program

The Child and Adolescent Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy Training Program (CAPPT) is a unique, clinically-oriented psychoanalytic psychotherapy training program. Its focus is to train mental health professionals in the intensive treatment of children and adolescents who are experiencing psychological and developmental difficulties.

Today's complex lives demand that psychotherapists develop specific skills in the understanding of child development and the ability to help children, parents, and the community. To meet these challenges, this program is designed to provide comprehensive training in child assessment and psychotherapy for emotionally distressed children, adolescents, and their families, and to serve as a model for the development of similar training programs. Candidates include: physicians, psychologists, social workers, and other mental health professionals who have had experience in working with children and adolescents.

ELIGIBILITY

The Child & Adolescent Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy Program is open to mental health professionals from psychiatry, child psychiatry, psychology, social work, counseling, psychiatric nursing, as well as other professionals who work with children. All participants in the program must be licensed and/or certified to practice psychotherapy in the State of Illinois and have malpractice insurance coverage for the psychotherapy practices. Copies of license and insurance coverage must be provided upon acceptance into the program.

FORMAT

A combined theory and clinical track to study contemporary models of the therapeutic process, along with a systematic exploration of the clinical exchange. Coursework to include child assessment, working with parents, psychotherapy, development, and trauma, amongst others.

FACULTY

All seminars and supervision sessions are taught by members of the faculties of The Chicago Institute for Psychoanalysis, as well as other experts in the field of child and adolescent psychodynamic psychotherapy.
